3 AIR QUALITY

3.1 DEPOSITIONAL DUST

Depositional dust gauges for the March monitoring period were collected on 09 April 2019. All depositional dust sampling locations were in compliance with the annual average limit (4g/m²/month) for the month of March 2019. Maximum annual increase in deposited dust levels are also below the criteria limit of 2 g/m²/month. Depositional dust monitoring results are presented in **Table 1**.

3.2 PM₁₀ AND TSP (HIGH VOLUME AIR SAMPLERS)

Monitoring of particulate concentrations less than ten (10) micrometres (PM₁₀) was undertaken using High Volume Air Samplers on a six (6) day, 24 hour run cycle. PM₁₀ concentrations for March 2019 were in compliance with the maximum allowable limit of 50µg/m³. The total suspended particulates (TSP) concentration was determined from the PM₁₀ concentrations. Annual average concentrations for TSP and PM₁₀ were in compliance with the annual average limit for the month of March 2019.

PM₁₀ and TSP results for March 2019 are presented in **Table 2**.

4 WATER QUALITY

A discharge event is deemed to occur when water leaves the site either through the overflow channel of the Main Dam or as a result of actively pumping water. No discharge events occurred at LD002 during March 2019. The sample at Main Dam was collected for due diligence purposes only. Water quality results are presented in **Table 3**.
