3 ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION LICENCE DETAILS

3.1 DEPOSITIONAL DUST

All depositional dust sampling locations were in compliance with the rolling annual average limit (4 g/m 2 /month) for the period April 2023 to March 2024. The maximum annual increase in deposited dust levels are also below the criteria limit of 2 g/m 2 /month. Depositional dust monitoring results are presented in **Table 1**.

3.2 PM10 AND TSF

The 24-hour maximum particulate matter concentration less than 10 microns (PM₁₀) and total suspended particulate (TSP) were not recorded for the month of March 2024 due to a delay in the replacement of the dust gauge generator. The TSP and PM₁₀ annual rolling average results were calculated with the available data for the period of April 2023 to March 2024. The average values were less than the annual average EPL limit as presented in **Table 2**.

4 SURFACE WATER QUALITY

A discharge event is deemed to occur when water leaves the site either through the overflow channel of the Main Dam or as a result of actively pumping water. No discharge occurred from the Main Dam Discharge Point 2 (LD002) during March 2024. A monthly sample was collected from the Main Dam for due diligence. Water quality results are presented in **Table 3**.
