1 INTRODUCTION

Castlereagh Coal owns and operates Cullen Valley Mine located near Cullen Bullen in the Central West district of New South Wales. This report has been prepared pursuant to Chapter 2, Part 3.5, Condition 66(6) of the Protection of the Environment operations Act 1997 for the publication of results of monitoring and the NSW Environmental Protection Authority guideline titled Requirements for publishing pollution monitoring data (2013).

3 ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION LICENCE DETAILS

3.1 DEPOSITIONAL DUST

All depositional dust sampling locations were in compliance with the rolling annual average limit (4 g/m² /month) for the period April 2025 to March 2026. Maximum annual increase in deposited dust levels is below the criteria limit of 2 g/m² /month. Depositional dust monitoring results are presented in **Table 1**.

3.2 PM₁₀, PM_{2.5} AND TSP

The 24-hour maximum PM₁₀ particulate matter concentration less than 10 microns (PM₁₀) criterion of 50 µg/m³ was not exceeded during March 2026. The PM₁₀, PM_{2.5} and total suspended particulate (TSP) annual average results were compliant with the annual average limit for the period April 2025 to March 2026.

PM₁₀, PM_{2.5} and TSP results for March 2026 are presented in **Table 2**.

4 SURFACE WATER QUALITY

A discharge event is deemed to occur when water leaves the site either through the overflow channel or as a result of actively pumping water. Site did not discharge from Dam 3 (EPA Point 1) in March 2026, samples were collected from Dam 3 for due diligence purposes only. Discharge was observed at Dam 4 (EPA Point 4) throughout March 2026 and was sampled weekly.

A variation to analyte concentration limits was received by the EPA as part of the variation to EPL10341 on 8 August 2025. Analyte concentrations were within limits for all weeks during discharge in March 2026, other than Copper which was exceeded in one week, and Iron which was exceeded in all four weeks.

Dam 3 was sampled for due diligence purposes only as there was no discharge conducted throughout the reporting period.
